

GoRead should be used to log your child's reading. Pupils have been given passcodes.

Children need to read a minimum of 3 times a week at home.



Behaviour

We expect all children to be safe, happy, healthy and respectful while in school. At the beginning of the school year each class will form a set of class rules which they will be expected to follow.

They will also be given special achievement certificates during our weekly Achievement Assembly.

If children do not follow school rules, they will be placed on the class behaviour chart and their behaviour will be monitored regularly. If unacceptable behaviour continues, we will telephone or write to parents so that we can work together to help support children with behaviour issues.



School Uniform

All children attending Beaumont Lodge Primary school are expected to wear uniform at all times.

Full school uniform is expected from September 2022: White/blue t shirt/polo t-shirt, grey/black skirt, trousers or shorts and navy-blue sweatshirt / fleece. Visit https://uniform-direct.com/ to order.

Please ensure pupils do not come to school wearing gel or acrylic nails, or nail polish.

Vest tops, crop tops, jeans and hoodies are not permitted for school.

A school bag is required to allow children to bring letters and books home.

Sensible indoor shoes are required, ideally labelled plimsolls.



PE kit reminders + indoor shoes



We expect PE kits to be in school from Mon to Fri. On Fridays, PE kits should be taken home to be washed. PE kits should contain appropriate clothing – including outdoor clothing and should be labelled.

PE kits: There is a PE uniform that needs to be followed by all children (nursery to Y6). PE kits are: a white or blue t shirt, black shorts/joggers and a black or navy jumper.

All clothes and shoes need to be labelled, school cannot take responsibility for lost items.

We advise children do not have their ears pierced during the school year as they are unable to participate in PE, Swimming or other sports events unless they can independent remove their earrings. Only stud earrings are permitted.

Lunch money



School dinners can be purchased for £9.50 weekly, paid via Scopay. School dinners will not be ordered unless payment has been made. We actively encourage parents to check if they qualify for Free School Meals and milk (this actually helps our school receive additional funding!). You can check your eligibility by phoning 0116 4541009 option 3 or going on the Leicester City Council website.

If you would like your child to have milk at break time, please visit Coolmilk and pay online.



Water bottles

No water bottles will be needed from September, water fountains will be available for children to use. Only pupils with a medical condition and approval from the school office will be permitted to have water bottles.

Sun cream



Pupils are not permitted to bring sun cream to school. We ask parents apply sun cream in the morning before the start of the school day. On sunny days, it advisable to send labelled sun hats for your child to wear. Prescription sun glasses are permitted.
