



Stone Age, Iron Age, Bronze Age

This topic develops the timeline of early Britain, by establishing a strong context. We learn about how life and civilisation develop through these three crucial ages, what changed and why. By becoming archaeologists, we learn about how the secrets of the past can be uncovered, focussing particularly on Skara Brae and Bradgate Park and what remains at these key areas.



The Egyptians

Who were the Egyptians? What did they achieve? We ask questions and using a range of evidence sources, we find answers about the past. We learn about the technology developed by this ancient civilisation, such as the Shaduf. We explore rivers, particularly the River Nile and learn about how rivers can affect daily life.



Mountains

In this unit we develop our map skills, locating mountain ranges across the world, learning about animals that reside near or on them. We learn about explorers linked to mountains, including Ernest Shackleton.





Route to Resilience

The school is working hard developing its Route to Resilience, but what is this? Put simply it is recognising, understanding and developing the character traits that make us unique and then using these 'character muscles' to allow us to be the best version of ourselves. At our school, pupils are given every opportunity to rehearse and strengthen their sense of themselves.



School Councils UK

A school council is a brilliant way of representing and contributing to pupil voice in our school. They help to make decisions about how the school is run and take on projects that support the children's learning and development, such as organising charity events, representing the school at outside events or ensuring the school is environmentally friendly.



ECO Club

The Eco-Schools programme is a path the school is taking to improve the environment in both the school and the local community. We aim to use this programme to have a life-long positive impact on the lives of young people and their families.



Gardening

Beaumont Lodge Primary School is fortunate to have school grounds that offer our pupils many opportunities. One such opportunity is learning how to maintain a garden and grow your own food. During lessons and afterschool clubs, we will be teaching children how they can too become great gardeners!



Reading expectations – GoRead should be used to log your child's reading. Pupils have been given passcodes and we will be using this in class too.

Spellings expectations – spellings to practise ahead of each week's Friday spelling test will be posted onto Seesaw one week before. Children should practise writing new words into complete sentences to ensure understanding of meaning.



Behaviour

We expect all children to be safe, happy, healthy and respectful while in school. At the beginning of the school year each class will form a set of class rules which they will be expected to follow.

They will also be given special achievement certificates during our weekly Achievement Assembly.

If children do not follow school rules, they will be placed on the class behaviour chart and their behaviour will be monitored regularly. If unacceptable behaviour continues, we will telephone or write to parents so that we can work together to help support children with behaviour issues.



School Uniform

Full school uniform is expected from September 2022: White/blue t shirt/polo t-shirt, grey/black skirt, trousers or shorts and navy-blue sweatshirt / fleece.

Please ensure pupils do not come to school wearing gel or acrylic nails, or nail polish.

Vest tops, crop tops, jeans and hoodies are not permitted for school.

A school bag is required to allow children to bring letters and books home.

Sensible indoor shoes are required, ideally labelled plimsolls.

Other reminders



PE kit reminders + indoor shoes

We expect PE kits to be in school from Mon to Fri. On Fridays, PE kits should be taken home to be washed. There is a PE uniform that needs to be followed by all children (nursery to Y6). PE kits are: a white or blue t shirt, black shorts/joggers and a black or navy jumper.

All clothes and shoes need to be labelled, school cannot take responsibility for lost items.

We advise children do not have their ears pierced during the school year as they are unable to participate in PE, Swimming or other sports events unless they can independent remove their earrings. Only stud earrings are permitted.



Breakfast club

Beaumont Lodge Primary school is able to offer a Breakfast Club thanks to funding from Greggs bakery. Following breakfast (cereal, toast and juice), pupils then are sent to classrooms ready for learning. More information about Breakfast club will be sent out in September with details on how you can sign your child up to this service.



Milk

Lunch money

Dinner money (Years 3-6): should be paid online by Scopay. The cost of this is £9.50 per week.

We actively encourage parents to check if they qualify for Free School Meals and milk (this actually helps our school receive additional funding!) You can check your eligibility by phoning 0116 4541009 option 3 or going on the Leicester City Council website.



Personal Details

The school uses a range of different ways to contact parents and keep them updated about school. It is important that all telephone numbers, addresses and medical information are kept up to date.



Water

No water bottles will be needed from September, water fountains will be available for children to use. Only pupils with a medical condition and approval from the school office will be permitted to have water bottles.



Sun cream

Pupils are not permitted to bring sun cream to school. We ask parents apply sun cream in the morning before the start of the school day. On sunny days, it is advisable to send labelled sun hats for your child to wear. Prescription sun glasses are permitted.
